

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this 6th day of March, 1950, that,

WHEREAS, the building constructed about 1935 for bath house located near the Fair Grounds at Whiteriver has been converted into living quarters and has been occupied by Thomas Thompson, a member of the Tribe, for a number of years, and,

WHEREAS, Thomas Thompson desires to purchase this building for a permanent home and since it is no longer needed by the tribe, it is hereby authorized by the Tribal Council that said building be sold to Thomas Thompson at the appraised value and the Chairman of the Tribal Council is authorized to sign sales agreement for the Council.

The foregoing Resolution was on the 6th day of March, 1950 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (c) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
