

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the horse trails which tap the most rugged and inaccessible areas of the Reservation are, as a result of little or no maintenance throughout the past ten years, difficult to travel and in some instances impassable and,

WHEREAS, these horse trails are essential in forest fire protection and suppression and also in administering reservation stock-raising activities,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this first day of May, 1950 that Tribal Funds in the amount of nine thousand dollars (\$9,000.00) be set aside for the purpose of maintaining and improving reservation horse trails and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the money so set aside be made available for use as of May 1, 1950 and that the balance as of June 30, 1950 may be expended during the fiscal year 1951 for the purposes set forth in this Resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on May 1, 1950 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (c) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
