

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the present fire season, because of extremely dry conditions in our forest and range lands, promises to be the most dangerous in many years, and

AND WHEREAS, it is essential that every effort shall be made and sufficient protection personnel shall be available to protect our forest and range lands from fire,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session this first day of May, 1950 that twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) of tribal funds be allotted for forest fire protection and pre-suppression purposes.

The foregoing resolution was on May 1, 1950 duly accepted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (c) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
