

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache
Tribe of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation
that,

WHEREAS, bears are doing a great amount of damage to Indian-
owned livestock on the Fort Apache Indian
Reservation, that funds heretofore approved
for Predatory Animal Control may be used to
pay bounties on bears to non-Indians when
such person is specifically authorized to
trap and hunt bears that are inflicting
damage upon livestock,

The foregoing resolution was on the 14th day of July,
1950 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against,
by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe
pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1
(p) of the Constitution and by-laws of the Tribe, ratified
by the Tribe on August 18, 1938 and approved by the Secretary
of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of
the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 964).
