

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, on June 5, 1950 a forest fire east of Cooley Mountain burned over approximately ninety acres and killed 78,030 feet of Ponderosa pine, and

WHEREAS, this Fire-killed timber will, unless it is logged this Fall, become unmerchantable,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in special session this 16th day of August, 1950 that the fire-killed timber on the said Cooley Mountain Burn be advertised at a minimum price of \$5.00 per M and sold to the highest bidder, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Council approve payment of fire-killed timber on the Cooley Mountain burn on a gross tree scale basis, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman and the Secretary of the White Mountain Apache Tribe are hereby authorized to sign for and in behalf of the said Tribe in contract covering sale of fire-killed timber on the Cooley Mountain burn.

The foregoing Resolution was on August 16, 1950 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (c) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
