

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache  
Tribe of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation in regular  
session on September 11, 1950 that,

WHEREAS, certain range units which cannot be advantageously used by  
Indian livestock are hereby authorized to be advertised  
and grazing permits for three years issued in accordance  
with regulations as follows:

Range Unit #3 carrying capacity at 250 cattle for three  
months, minimum grazing fee \$2.00 per head per season.

Range Unit #10, sheep range is suitable only for sheep  
grazing and has a carrying capacity at 5000 head of  
sheep for four months, minimum fee 60¢ per head per  
season.

Range Unit #13A to be reduced from former area to permit  
Indian cattle to use the open country. Carrying capacity,  
70 head of cattle, minimum rate for fee, \$2.25 per head  
per season.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that other range units not listed above which  
during the past three years have been under grazing per-  
mits are hereby reserved for Indian stock.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman of the Tribal Council is  
authorized to sign grazing permits on behalf of the tribe.

The foregoing Resolution was on September 11, 1950 duly adopted by  
a vote of 8 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White  
Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by article VI,  
Section 1 (c) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by  
the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Inter-  
ior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934  
(48 Stat. 964).
