

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, The Grasshopper and Oak Creek Cattle Associations have found it necessary to obtain additional range for livestock to provide grazing lands for Indian owned livestock, and

WHEREAS, the area covered by the grazing permit issued to W. K. Jay will provide the necessary range,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, or his authorized representative be requested to cancel the grazing permit (Contract No. I-30-ind-2533) dated November 14, 1947, issued to W. K. Jay, Young, Arizona, effective April 30, 1950, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that since the said permit provided for the construction of certain range fences, the cost thereof in the amount of \$1,000.00 to be applied toward the specified grazing fees, and since the fences will be valuable to the Indian livestock owners it is recommended that the balance of grazing fees due in the amount of \$50.00 be waived to partially offset the added cost to the permittee of constructing said fences over rough terrain in the permit area.

The foregoing Resolution was on January 16, 1950 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (a) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 964).
