

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Eugene Ethelbah, a member of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has completed two years of college training in engineering and desires to complete this college education at the University of New Mexico.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that a loan to Eugene Ethelbah in the amount of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) is hereby authorized and approved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said loan will not be effective until Council has received written evidence of Eugene Ethelbah's acceptance at the University of New Mexico and that during the period of his attending school the council will receive copies of reports showing satisfactory completion of the subjects studied; provided that said Eugene Ethelbah shall obtain adequate term life insurance naming the tribe as beneficiary as additional security for said loan and provided further, that repayments on said loan shall begin within two months after graduation or leaving school.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this loan is hereby authorized from General Funds on deposit in the Individual Indian Money Account with the Fort Apache Agency.

The foregoing Resolution was on April 3, 1951 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 1 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section (e) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
