


RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

BE IT RESOLVED that the tribe invite the National Probation and Parole Association to study and make a survey and report, with recommendations, on the juvenils delinquency problem on the Fort Apache Reservation for which the tribe hereby obligates itself to pay the amounts indicated in the letter dated 15 March 1951 from John Schapps to tribal attorney Wright. Said letter indicating a maximum of four weeks for the study at an estimated maximum cost of eight hundred dollars (\$800.00) for the survey and report.

The foregoing Resolution was on May 7, 1951 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section (e) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
