RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, for a number of years there has been need of a social worker and a placement officer on the Fort Apache Reservation to help the Indian people in many of their social and family problems and,

WHEREAS, in recent years the need for a social worker has become acute, as there is no one on the staff of the Fort Apache Agency that can devote sufficient time to many welfare cases in addition to their other duties and,

WHEREAS, there are many opportunities for Indians to obtain employment that are missed because the Agency does not have sufficient staff to locate jobs and employment opportunities and assist Indians in obtaining such employment.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Commissioner of Indian Affairs is requested to include in the budget for the Bureau of Indian Affairs for fiscal year 1953 sufficient funds for employment of a qualified social worker to be located on the Fort Apache Reservation to assist the Indian people in many of their social and unemployment problems.

The foregoing Resolution was on July 9, 1951 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to Authority vested in it by Article VI, Section (a) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
