

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

BE IT RESOLVED by the council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session on September 26, 1951 that,

WHEREAS, in order to provide for protection of wildlife and enforcement of game laws and regulations that there is hereby authorized that two game wardens be employed at Chediski area, one at Limestons and one at Maverick and McNary from October 1, 1951 to January 31, 1952.

The salary of the game wardens appointed shall be at the rate of two hundred dollars (\$200) per month for the period authorized.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that three thousand two hundred dollars (\$3200) of funds now on deposit in individual Indian Money accounts to the credit of the tribe is hereby authorized to be used for the salary of the four game wardens.

The foregoing Resolution was on the 26th day of September, 1951 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
