

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Lutheran Mission has applied for a site near the Fort Apache School for erecting thereon a chapel building to facilitate its program of religious instruction, and

WHEREAS, the Council is agreeable to this request,

BE IT RESOLVED that the Council hereby concurs in the issuance by the Superintendent a revocable permit covering the use of tribal land for this purpose; Provided, (1) That the Area covered be limited to a reasonable size required for the purpose requested, (2) that the permit provide for the use of the land to revert to the tribe whenever it ceases to be used for the purpose for which requested, (3) that the term of the permit be in accordance with Article VI, Section 1 (c) of the Constitution, and (4) that the permit be renewable with the approval of the council at the expiration of this term upon application of the permittee.

The foregoing resolution was on December 3, 1951 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (c) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
