

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, in the operation of the Whiteriver Public School it has been exceedingly difficult to obtain the services of competent teachers for the reason that adequate housing is not available, and

WHEREAS, several Apache children attend this school and the council is anxious to lend every encouragement to the continuation and enlargement of this school, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED that the council hereby authorizes the construction at Whiteriver of two frame cottages similar to the recently constructed stockman's cottage at Cedar Creek; that these two cottages be reserved for rental to teachers employed by the Public School board so long as that need exists, rentals to be fixed from time to time by the council and to be credited to the tribal fund.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the sum of nineteen thousand dollars (\$19,000) for this purpose is hereby authorized and appropriated from tribal funds on deposit in an Individual Indian Money account with the Fort Apache Agency.

The foregoing resolution was on December 3, 1951 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section (d) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
