

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, on June 21, 1950, application of the Central Arizona Light and Power Company for a right of way over lands of the Fort Apache Reservation was approved in advance of an agreement as to the damages and rentals involved, and

WHEREAS, by Resolutions Nos. 50-18 and 50-19, adopted May 31, 1950, the Council accepted the rates of \$25 per acre for the land occupied by the generating plant and \$10 per mile for the transmission lines as annual rental, therefore,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in session this 7th. day of January, 1952, that a lump sum payment of \$382.95 be accepted as damages for cut timber on the said right-of-way.

The foregoing resolution was on January 7, 1952 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (n) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).


RESOLUTION OF THE


WHEREAS, there will be continuing need for educational facilities on this reservation, and

WHEREAS, the Whiteriver Public School district has applied for an assignment of land at Whiteriver for a school location, therefore,


BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in session this 4th day of February, 1952, that the tract of tribal land, approximately ten acres in area, located East of the Nurses Home, and described on the attached map, be hereby set aside for and assigned to the Whiteriver Public School District for school purposes, such assignment to continue in effect so long as the land is so used.

The foregoing Resolution was on February 4, 1952 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VIII of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
