

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


- WHEREAS, the range and grazing resource of the Carrizo, Forestdale, Amos, West and Flying-V Horse pasture Units are in fair to unsatisfactory condition and some are deteriorating, and
- WHEREAS, the policy of the tribe and Council is to conserve and protect the range and grazing resource of its reservation, and
- WHEREAS, Ordinance 21 authorized the issuance of grazing permits for the various Indian livestock associations,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe as follows:

1. That a grazing permit be issued to the Carrizo-Forestdale Indian Livestock Association under the following conditions:
 - (a) The grazing permit shall include the units now known as the Carrizo Unit, Forestdale Unit, Earl West Unit, Amos Unit, Haystack Unit, Flying-V Horse Pasture Unit, Jackson Pasture Unit and Dry Valley Units.
 - (b) The maximum cow months use permitted will be 16,800 cow months per year, (cattle and horse only, all cattle 6 months or over in age will be counted as one head, all horses 6 months or more of age will be counted in the ratio of 1 horse equals 1 1/2 cattle for example, 2 horses for one month will be counted as 3 cow months use).
 - (c) The West Unit (including Dry Valley) will be closed to grazing or use for the years of 1953, 1954 and 1955. The Amos Unit (including Jackson Pasture Unit) will be closed to grazing or use for the years of 1953 and 1954.
 - (d) The grazing permit will be issued for a five year period beginning on or about May 1, 1953 and end on April 30, 1958. The permit will not extend beyond the period of April 30, 1958 under any conditions.
 - (e) Grazing fees will not be charged but the Tribal Council reserves the right to charge grazing fees during the term of the permit if conditions warrant.
 - (f) Grazing permits will be executed as provided by the range management section of the Bureau of Indian Affairs Manual.
 - (g) Only livestock belonging to bonafide members of the Carrizo-Forestdale Indian Livestock Association shall be granted grazing privileges under the grazing permit issued to that association. The Association will furnish a list of its members showing the number of livestock by class,

- (g) sex, and, etc., owned by each member of the Tribal Council not later than May 1 of each year.
- (h) The Carrizo-Forestdale Indian Livestock Association may limit the maximum number of livestock that any member may graze under the grazing permit.
- (i) Joint ownership of livestock with non-Indian spouse shall not be accepted as qualifying for free grazing privileges, or membership in the association. Proof of Indian spouse ownership of livestock will be proved by the Indian spouse owner by written documents attesting to how livestock were obtained.
- (j) The use of the several units will be based on the deferred-rotational method of range management as will be determined by joint meetings of the Carrizo-Forestdale Indian Livestock Association and members of the staff of the Fort Apache Agency branches of Extension and Forest and Range Management. It is understood that yearlong grazing of any unit will not be permitted.

The foregoing Resolution was on April 6, 1953 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Ordinance No. 21; Article VI, Section 1 (f,h,j and n) and Article VIII of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
