

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, in Bear Canyon west of Whiteriver there is a stand of merchantable ponderosa pine and Douglas fir timber lying outside the Carriso Working Circle boundary, and

WHEREAS, Howard Penrod a tribal member has discussed the purchase of this timber with this council under authority of paragraph 61.17 Title 25 C.F.R.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that a contract according to regulations be made with Howard Penrod at a price of eight dollars (\$8.00) per thousand board feet gross tree scale, and that the Chairman and Secretary be authorized to sign such contract.

The foregoing Resolution was on September 8, 1953 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to a thority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (n) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
