

RESOLUTION OF THE
 WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
 FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, there is need for additional funds in the tribal budget for fiscal year 1954 for the following reasons:

- (1) The condition of two of the police vehicles makes further repair expense uneconomical.
- (2) The sum appropriated for court, jail and police expenses is now found to be inadequate.
- (3) An unexpected number of trips off the reservation has become necessary for members of the Council and funds appropriated for that purpose have been depleted.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the additional amount of eight thousand five hundred dollars (\$8,500) be hereby appropriated and authorized from tribal funds on deposit in the I. I. M. Accounts of the Fort Apache Agency for the following purposes:

- (1) Purchase of two $\frac{1}{2}$ -ton pickups for police use, trade-in or sale of two units is also authorized \$2,500.00
- (2) For expenses of the tribal court, jail and police for balance of fiscal year ending June 30, 1954 5,000.00
- (3) For miscellaneous expenses of the council, including per diem of members while on trips away from the reservation for the balance of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1954 1,000.00

The foregoing Resolution was on March 1, 1954 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
