

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, employment opportunities on the reservation have been scarce during the winter and spring months and the 1953 returns from cattle were at a record low and there is acute suffering among a large number of the people of the reservation, and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Council that some temporary means of alleviating suffering be found to tide the people over until conditions improve, and

WHEREAS, it is also the desire of the Council that some lasting benefit accrue to the tribe through expenditure of its funds, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the sum of sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000) be hereby appropriated from funds on deposit in the S.D.A. accounts of the Fort Apache Agency for cutting excess and harmful juniper trees from the range lands of the reservation, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that these funds be used to pay wages to members of the tribe engaged in this work.

The foregoing Resolution was on May 3, 1954 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
