

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, a forest fire on June 19, 1954 killed approximately 4,300,000 board feet of ponderosa pine timber on 1,500 acres near Mollary, and

WHEREAS, this fire killed timber should be sold at the earliest possible date to prevent loss in value,

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the council that the above mentioned timber be advertised according to regulations at not less than \$12.00 per thousand board feet gross tree scale for oral bidding, and that the Chairman of the Council be authorized to sign a contract with the high bidder for this proposed sale. Funds for advertisement by newspaper are hereby appropriated in amount not to exceed \$25.00.

The foregoing Resolution was on July 6, 1954 duly adopted by a vote of for and against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section (n) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
