

RESOLUTION OF THE
 WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
 FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the funds allotted on Tribal Budget TR 54-18 under Section VII (e) for the purpose of paying bounties for the scalps of certain predatory animals have been expended, and

WHEREAS, the council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe wishes to discontinue entirely the bounty on Porcupines, and to raise the bounty on Wildcats from five dollars (\$5.00) to ten dollars (\$10.00), with the bounty on the other Predatory Animals remaining the same as at present,

NOW BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the sum of three thousand dollars (\$3,000.00) be and is hereby appropriated from tribal funds on deposit in the SDA accounts of the Fort Apache Indian Agency for the purpose of paying bounties for the scalps of predators according to the following schedule:

Raccoon - - - - -	\$3.00	Little Bear - - - - -	\$10.00
Coyote - - - - -	\$5.00	Big Bear - - - - -	\$25.00
Wildcat - - - - -	\$10.00	Any Lion - - - - -	\$50.00

The foregoing Resolution was on September 27, 1954 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1(d) of the Constitution and by-laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984)
