

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, economic conditions on the Fort Apache Reservation have drastically worsened since 1952, due to abnormal drop in cattle prices and job opportunities for Indians have decreased sharply due to economic conditions in the industries on and adjacent to the reservation, and

WHEREAS, during the present year the council found it necessary to appropriate the sum of \$60,000 for emergency relief work, and

WHEREAS, the tribe participates in the program of the Arizona Employment Security Commission and during the first three quarters of 1954 has paid unemployment insurance totaling \$1,786., and

WHEREAS, the Council has conferred with local officials of the Employment Security Commission and are in agreement that entitlement and need exists for full employment service on the reservation,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Employment Security Commission is hereby petitioned to establish full-time employment service on the Fort Apache Reservation.

The foregoing Resolution was on November 3, 1954 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (a) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1933 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1933 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
