

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the mineral resources of the Fort Apache Reservation be utilized to the best financial interest of the Tribe, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to Article VI, Section 1 (c) of the Constitution, that the Department of the Interior is hereby requested to arrange for the sale of prospecting permits and /or leases under such Regulations and conditions as deemed to be in the best interests of the tribe, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the draft of the proposed advertisement of five delineated areas of reservation land for the sale of permits to prospect for uranium and associated minerals is hereby approved by the council subject to any changes required by the Department of the Interior.

The foregoing resolution was on December 7, 1954 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (c) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
