


RESOLUTION OF THE

 FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, the Council desires to continue to offer a cash bounty for the scalps of animals declared to be Predators, and


WHEREAS, the funds set up for this purpose in Tribal Resolution TR 53-21 are now depleted, now

BE IT RESOLVED that the sum of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2500.00) is hereby appropriated from tribal funds on deposit in the S.D.A. accounts of the Fort Apache Indian Agency for the purpose of paying a cash bounty on animals declared to be Predators. Any balance remaining on June 30, 1954 shall be returned to the General Account of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing Resolution was on February 1, 1954 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
