

RESOLUTION OF THE  
 WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
 FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the infestation of grasshoppers on range lands of the Fort Apache Reservation has been increasingly serious and may become critical in certain areas in the immediate future, and

WHEREAS, the U. S. Bureau of Entomology has indicated that Control measures may be instituted if the tribe will contribute one-third of the cost, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the sum of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) be hereby authorized for expenditure from funds on deposit at the Fort Apache Agency for the above purpose should the Bureau of Entomology decide to institute control measures.

The foregoing Resolution was on May 2, 1955 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (e) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
