

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, employment opportunities for members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe continue to be scarce, and considerable hardship is being experienced on this account,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the sum of sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000) be hereby appropriated from tribal funds on deposit in the I.I.M. Accounts of the Fort Apache Agency for use in financing work programs among members of the tribe in accordance with the following:

1. Work projects shall be confined to those affording improvements to reservation resources, such as juniper eradication, fence maintenance and repair, road and trail maintenance and improvement, etc.
2. That wages be paid to tribal members at the rate of five dollars (\$5.00) per day and that employment be limited to five days per week.

The foregoing Resolution was on January 3, 1955 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
