

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe have contributed funds to the various associations for juniper control and

WHEREAS, ACP payments were qualified for by the said associations resulting from the use of these funds and

WHEREAS, the sum of one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.) each have been received by Carrizo, Cibecue, North Fork, Canyon Day, Cedar Creek and Tankey Creek Associations as ACP payments for juniper control work

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the Tribal Council, White Mountain Apache Tribe, that these said ACP payments should remain in the livestock association accounts to be earmarked for soil conservation purposes subject to supervision of the Branch of Land Operations, Fort Apache Agency.

The foregoing Resolution was on December 5, 1955 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (e) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
