

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, The Lutheran Church of Hope of Phoenix, Arizona, has made application to the council for a lease covering a group of tribal buildings known as the Williams Creek Camp to be used by them for the purpose of establishing and operating a camp for religious instruction, and

AND WHEREAS, the proposed lease meets with the approval of the council, therefore,

IT IS RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman of the Council is authorized to sign a lease, or the Superintendent of the Agency to issue a revocable permit, either document to be in accordance with the Constitution of the Tribe and shall include but not be limited by the following conditions:

1. The lease or permit shall be for a period not exceeding ten years and shall contain an option for renewal.
2. The lessee or permittee shall be responsible for maintenance of the camp and shall carry fire insurance thereon.
3. The lessee or permittee shall pay a fee of not less than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) per year as rental, said rental to be credited to the Tribe's Recreation Enterprise.

The foregoing Resolution was on April 4, 1955 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (c) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
