

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, White Mountain Apache Tribe, is authorized by its Constitution and By-Laws, approved August 26, 1938, to manage all economic affairs and enterprises of the Tribe, Article VI, Section 1 (n),

AND WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, White Mountain Apache Tribe, recognized and approved the Articles and By-Laws of the General Livestock Board,

AND WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, White Mountain Apache Tribe, recognizes the purposes and aims of the General Livestock Board as follows:

- (1) To coordinate the range conservation, cattle growing and marketing activities of the White Mountain Apache Indian Livestock Associations.
- (2) To set general policies pertaining to matters of a general nature concerning the Indian livestock industry, including the collection and disbursement of funds for general livestock purposes,


AND WHEREAS, we, the Council, feel that it is desirable and suitable that we should assume more of the managerial responsibilities for Tribal agricultural enterprises,


AND WHEREAS, the General Livestock Board, recommended by Resolution, January 17, 1956, the establishment of the position of the General Livestock Manager and agreed to assume 50% of the cost of salary and expenses of such position to be paid from the General Livestock fund,

THEFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the position of General Livestock Manager be established and the White Mountain Apache Tribe shall assume 50% of the salary and expenses and that the Superintendent is hereby authorized to make payment from the I. D. Ranch Herd Expense Fund in support of this position,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the position of General Livestock Manager shall be established at the equivalent of a GS-7 and be subject to increases in salary and leave equivalent to a government employee of like grade.

The foregoing Resolution was on January 23, 1956 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (n) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

**I. NATURE AND PURPOSE OF WORK:**

**A. Introduction:**

In accordance with Resolution No. 56-1, dated 1/23/56 passed by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council, the incumbent performs the duties of General Livestock Manager within the General Livestock Association, White Mountain Apaches, which is responsible for coordination and proper management of the livestock industry on the Fort Apache Reservation.

**B. Duties:**

- 20% (1) Supervision of the Tribal Herd operations which operates to produce pure-bred herd sires for issuing to livestock associations and purebred breeding cattle for sale to individual Indians. The General Livestock Manager supervises management, purchase and selection of breeding cattle, "weight-for-age" program and breeding to eliminate dwarfism.
- 20% (2) Supervision of Tribal Beef pastures, which includes coordination of vaccinations, grazing and fitting for market steers placed in these
