

RESOLUTION OF THE  
 WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
 PORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the various tribal activities and stock associations frequently require goods and services from local sources,

AND WHEREAS, the tribal office force would be relieved of much detailed work if such goods and services could be paid for in cash,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Clerk, being already properly bonded, be designated Agent Cashier for the Tribe authorized to make payments for goods and services furnished tribal activities and stock associations, such payments not to exceed fifty dollars (\$50.00) for any one invoice.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that five hundred dollars (\$500.00) be advanced to the designated Agent Cashier from local tribal funds to make initial payments. Later replenishments of the Agent Cashier Fund are to be made from the activities or stock associations in whose interest purchases are made. The Agent Cashier will periodically request such replenishment by a voucher supported by paid invoices.

The foregoing Resolution was on February 6, 1956 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section (d) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
