

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 55-36, adopted December 5, 1955 approved a budget of Eighty-three thousand two hundred eighty-six dollars and fifty cents (\$83,286.50) including an advance of Fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for operation of the White Mountain Recreational Enterprise, and,

WHEREAS, said Resolution was approved by Acting Assistant Commissioner of Indian Affairs on March 22, 1956 subject to the condition that the amount of Fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) be used only for the purchase or construction of capital goods and payment for plans and surveys, and

WHEREAS, it was the intent of the Council in adopting Resolution 55-36 that the amount stated therein were to be used for operating expenses of the Enterprise, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council fully realizes that the development of the recreational resources of the reservation will require capital investment in excess of revenue for a period of approximately five years and

WHEREAS, upon completion of the construction projects the only expense involved will be in maintenance and the income will exceed the expense

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the condition imposed by the Bureau of Indian Affairs in their letter of March 22, 1956, is hereby rejected.

The foregoing Resolution was on May 22, 1956 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (e) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
