

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Fish and Wildlife Service operates the Williams Creek Fish Hatchery largely for the stocking of the waters of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, it is in the interest of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to assist in the operation of this hatchery, and

WHEREAS, Tribal Resolution 215 of July 8, 1947 limited the amount of money the Tribe could furnish for such assistance to five thousand dollars (\$5,000) which amount is insufficient to pay in proportion for the increased use by the Tribe of the Williams Creek facilities,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the said Resolution 215 be rescinded

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman of the White Mountain Apache Tribe be authorized to negotiate and enter into cooperative agreement from year to year with the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service and the Fish and Game Commission of the State of Arizona to provide money, furnish equipment, and provide such other assistance toward the operation of the hatchery and the planting of fish in amounts as may be determined upon after negotiations with representatives of the Fish and Wildlife Service and the Arizona Fish and Game Department,

PROVIDED, that the disbursement of tribal funds be made in accordance with Indian Service regulations and that equipment be furnished on a loan basis.

The foregoing Resolution was on May 22, 1956 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (a) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
