FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, a number of Fair Exhibit buildings and the Grandstand at the Tribal Fairgrounds were destroyed by fire in February, 1956 and


WHEREAS, it is the desire and intention of the Council to continue holding an annual tribal fair in the belief that it is to the advantage of the Tribe,


THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in regular session that the amount of \$15,028.83, representing the insurance recovery on the destroyed buildings, be used from local tribal funds for the construction of a new exhibit building and rest rooms.

The foregoing Resolution was on July 17, 1956 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
