

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, there is urgent need for the development of adequate water and sewage systems for the Whiteriver Community and for the protection and convenience of the members of the Tribe residing therein, and

WHEREAS, the present water supply is unsatisfactory on at least three counts, namely:

- a. Insufficient quantities during periods of high demand and during low stream flow,
- b. Poor quality and high contamination during high river flows when muddy water enters the system and contamination from the town of McNary,
- c. High cost of operation and maintenance,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Council go on record that we are in complete agreement with the plans for the development of Domestic Water Supply for the Whiteriver Community, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Council is willing and desires to assume one-third of the cost of development of Domestic Water Supply for the Whiteriver Community.

The Foregoing Resolution was on August 6, 1956 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (e) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
