

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to assist and cooperate with the United States Public Health Service, in the program of curative and preventative medical work on the Fort Apache Reservation, and

WHEREAS, there is need at Cibecue Community for more adequate clinic facilities, and

WHEREAS, the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe by Resolution No. 53-42, dated November 2, 1953 did appropriate the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) from Tribal funds on deposit in the SEA Accounts of the Fort Apache Agency and did spend above stated sum for remodeling a tribally owned building in the Cibecue community for health clinic purposes,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman of the Council is hereby authorized to enter into and sign on behalf of the Tribe an agreement whereby the tribally owned building in the Cibecue community be released to the United States Government, to be operated and maintained by the United States Public Health Service, providing health services to the White Mountain Apache people of the Fort Apache Reservation.

The foregoing Resolution was on August 7, 1956 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (a) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
