

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, after investigation it is determined that Barry DeRose of Globe, Gila County, Arizona, an Attorney at Law, is qualified to act as general counsel for the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council to seek counsel as its general counsel,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that in order to provide funds for the retaining of Barry DeRose as legal counsel for the White Mountain Apache Tribe on miscellaneous tribal affairs and the Attorney's Contract with said attorney beginning August 9, 1956 and ending August 9, 1958, there is hereby authorized and appropriated from tribal funds on deposit with the Treasurer of the United States the sum of Six Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$6,600). Said funds to be expended in accordance with contract between Barry DeRose, Attorney at Law, and the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

The foregoing Resolution was on August 8, 1956 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (b) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
