

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the store building, merchandise, and equipment of the Apache Mercantile Company were totally destroyed by fire, and

WHEREAS, the building, merchandise and equipment were insured by the Heron Investment Company of Globe, Arizona, whose claims adjuster has offered the sum of Seventeen Thousand Three Hundred Forty-eight and Sixteen cents (\$17,348.16) in settlement of this loss,

NOW BE IT RESOLVED that this sum be accepted in settlement of this loss and that the Council Chairman be authorized to sign all necessary claims, proofs, certificates, etc., required by the Insurance Company.

The foregoing resolution was on September 24, 1956 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (n) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
