

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Council that tribal employees and councilmen transacting tribal business off the reservation or in remote areas on the reservation be fairly recompensed for their subsistence costs and

WHEREAS, the present rate of subsistence of \$9.00 per diem and mileage allowance of \$.07 per mile for personally-owned vehicles is too low in view of present high costs.


THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that tribal employees and councilmen be reimbursed at the rates of \$12.00 per diem and \$.09 per mile for use of personal vehicles for business transacted off the reservation and at the rate of \$3.80 per diem plus \$.09 per mile for personal vehicles when assigned to duty away from station but within the boundaries of the reservation.

PROVIDED, that the per diem in lieu of subsistence for an absence of more than twenty-four hours be computed on a calendar day (midnight to midnight) basis. For fractional parts of a day, one-fourth of the rate for the calendar day will be allowed for each period of six hours or fraction thereof and

PROVIDED, that no per diem will be allowed when the departure is after 8 a.m. and the return on the same day is prior to 6 p.m., or for any absence not exceeding three hours and

PROVIDED, that employees reimbursed for subsistence and mileage on the reservation be full-time tribal employees assigned to such duty by their supervisors, with travel requests approved by the Superintendent or Administrative Officer of the Fort Apache Indian Agency.

The foregoing resolution was on September 24, 1956 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
