

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Big Cienega Logging Unit located near Sheep Springs and the Springerville Road was logged between December 1, 1944 and July 10, 1945, and,

WHEREAS, there is on this unit approximately 270 acres of fir, spruce and some pine that was not cut due to steep ground and poor market conditions, and,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the above mentioned area be designated as "Big Cienega Spruce Fir Logging Unit" and that this timber be surveyed, appraised, and advertised for sale according to regulations, and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100.00) be made available for newspaper advertisement of this unit, and that the Chairman and Secretary of this Council be authorized to sign a contract for the sale of this timber.

The foregoing resolution was on November 6, 1956 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against, by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (n) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 19, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
