

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe recognizes that a repayment-in-kind cattle issue program is less satisfactory than a cash loan program in the future economic educational development of tribal members, and

WHEREAS, the Council believes that the continuance of a regular issue program to new cattle owners is necessary to the prosperity of the tribe and desires such a program to be in effect, and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Resolution 51-10 dated April 3, 1951, which authorized a repayment-in-kind cattle loan program, is hereby rescinded, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that cash loans be made through the Loan Committee of the Council to tribal members getting issues of cattle, such loans to be made from the revolving credit funds now on deposit in the IIM accounts, to be administered under revolving credit regulations as contained in the Credit Manual of the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

The foregoing Resolution was on January 16, 1957 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (n) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
