

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has received payment from Agricultural Stabilization & Conservation Program, U. S. Department of Agriculture, in the amount of \$12,000.00 in repayment of funds advanced to the eight livestock associations for the purpose of juniper control during Fiscal Year 1956, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council recognizes the benefits of this type of program to the tribal resources and the individual tribal members, and wishes to accelerate this program as far as tribal finances will permit,

IT IS THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that these ASC repayment funds in the amount of \$12,000.00 shall be deposited in IIM Account A-300 and allocated for juniper control to districts as follows:

Canyon Day	\$1,500.00
Carrizo	\$1,500.00
Cedar Creek	\$1,500.00
Cibecue	\$1,500.00
Grasshopper	\$1,500.00
North Fork	\$1,500.00
Oak Creek	\$1,500.00
7-Mile - Turkey Creek	\$1,500.00

These funds shall be expended in accordance with the previously approved juniper control regulations of the Tribal Council.

The foregoing Resolution was on February 18, 1957 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (n) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 15 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
