


RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE
OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, there is a stand of timber, principally ponderosa pine, along Nash Creek and Priebe Creek between Seven Mile Rim and George's Basin amounting to about 500,000 board feet which is in need of cutting, and,

WHEREAS, the drought is causing many trees to die, resulting in loss to the tribe,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Forest Manager be instructed to make the necessary survey and appraisal of this area to be known as the Nash-Priebe Creek Logging Unit for the Fort Apache Wholesale Lumber Company, a tribal enterprise, and that the Chairman and Secretary of this Council be authorized to make a contract with a qualified logging and milling operator to process this timber and deliver it to the Fort Apache Wholesale Lumber Company at Whiteriver.

The foregoing Resolution was on February 18, 1957, duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1(N) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
