

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE
OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, on September 6, 1956, the Commissioner of Indian Affairs authorized the opening of the Black River Roadless Area for timber sales, and,


WHEREAS, the necessary surveys and map are completed, market conditions are favorable and prospective purchasers have stated their desire to bid on said timber to be known as the Black River Logging Unit,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Forestry Branch make an appraisal of a portion of this unit for the purpose of advertisement and sale according to regulations, and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that tribal funds not to exceed \$100 be made available for advertisement and that the Chairman and Secretary of this Council be authorized to sign in concurrence a contract covering the sale of said timber.

The foregoing Resolution was on February 18, 1957, duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1(N) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
