

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to assist and cooperate with the United States Public Health Service in the therapeutic and preventative medical program on the Fort Apache Reservation, and

WHEREAS, there is need at Whiteriver, Arizona for more adequate hospital facilities, and

WHEREAS, United States Public Health Service are planning extensive alterations and expansion of the present hospital building in the near future, requiring the site on which the old Girl's Building No. 40 is located and which has now been transferred by Bureau of Indian Affairs to Public Health Service, involving survey action and demolition by Public Health Service.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman of the Council is hereby authorized to enter into and sign on behalf of the Tribe an occupancy grant or use agreement covering the area north of the hospital building, bounded on the north by "Main Drive Way" and on the east by street named "Drive Way" as shown on Whiteriver plat plan dated July 1953, an area approximately 265' x 315', for use and occupancy by the United States Public Health Service, providing health services to the White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Reservation.

The foregoing Resolution was on April 1, 1957 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (a) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
