

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to promote the development of human and natural resources on the Fort Apache Reservation, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council sponsored a White Mountain Apache Youth Camp during the summer of 1956 and also sponsors a reservation sports program for youths and adults, and

WHEREAS, Tribal Resolution No. 56-13 appropriating funds for 1957 Fiscal Year Tribal Budget was adopted May 7, 1956 and approved July 13, 1956 did not provide funds for Youth Camp for calendar year 1957, and

WHEREAS, the fairground grandstand, exhibit buildings, storage buildings and other facilities were destroyed or seriously damaged by fire February 26, 1956, and

WHEREAS, the insurance recovery money for the loss of these structures and facilities were used to partially rebuild these buildings and grandstand and nothing was done to repair or rebuild rodeo and baseball facilities located in the same general area.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that since grasshopper control funds will not be used as there is no apparent danger of an infestation during the remaining months of Fiscal Year 1957, therefore Fiscal Year 1957 Tribal Budget is hereby amended and funds in Section VII, (g) Grasshopper Control \$10,000.00 be used as follows: \$5,000.00 for Apache Youth Camp and \$5,000.00 for repair and rebuilding the rodeo arena and baseball diamond.

The foregoing resolution was on April 15, 1957 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (a) and (c) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 25, 1938, pursuant to Section 16 of Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
