

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


- WHEREAS, on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation there are ore bodies undeveloped; mineral ore bodies which may or may not be of commercial value, and
- WHEREAS, numerous inquiries and requests are made by non-members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to explore and prospect for said minerals, and
- WHEREAS, a certain amount of time and expense is involved in granting permission to non-members of the Tribe to prospect for minerals on the said reservation.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that a fee of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) be charged for each person, partnership or corporation who desires permission to prospect for minerals on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said permit shall not be granted exceeding sixty days and that if additional time is requested or needed by any person, individual or corporation an additional fee of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) shall be charged for said additional time not to exceed sixty days.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the person, individual or corporation desiring such prospecting permit shall designate the area he desires to prospect in, said area not to exceed 640 acres.

The foregoing Resolution was on May 17, 1957 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (h) and (n) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 13, 1934 (43 Stat. 984).
