

**RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION**

- WHEREAS, the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe recognizes the economic importance of the livestock industry to the tribal members of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, the Arizona Livestock Sanitary Board has agreed to establish within the exterior boundaries of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation a livestock district, and
- WHEREAS, the Arizona Livestock Sanitary Board has the authority to appoint inspectors and deputies to accomplish the objectives and purposes of the Board, and
- WHEREAS, the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe agrees to cooperate with the Arizona Livestock Sanitary Board in establishing a livestock district and appointing a livestock inspector, and
- WHEREAS, the said Arizona Livestock Sanitary Board has agreed to the appointing of a livestock inspector by the Tribal Council for the Fort Apache Indian Reservation Livestock District.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman of the Tribal Council is hereby authorized to execute a cooperative agreement with the Arizona Livestock Sanitary Board which agreement will provide among other things that the Tribal Council will employ a livestock inspector at a salary of \$300 per month plus the cost of his necessary transportation and the State will pay fifty percent of the said livestock inspector's salary. Said agreement to be effective the 1st day of July, 1958 for a period of one year ending June 30, 1959.

The foregoing resolution was on September 9, 1957 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (a) and (e) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
