

RESOLUTION OF THE
 WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
 FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, on April 15, 1957 the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe passed Resolution 57-33. Said resolution having as its primary purpose the rescision of Ordinance No. 23, and

WHEREAS, said resolution erroneously stated that Ordinance 23 was passed on February 5, 1957 instead of the correct date to-wit February 12, 1957, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary in order to rescind said Ordinance 23, to re-enact Resolution No. 57-33, and

WHEREAS, said Ordinance 23 was erroneously numbered Ordinance No. 23, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has previously passed Ordinance No. 23 which ordinance deals with traffic violations on the highways on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, in said resolution passed February 12, 1957 Ordinances 13, 18 and 22 dealing with range management were rescinded, and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Tribal Council to correct the action of February 12, 1957.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Ordinance 23 enacted February 12, 1957 be and the same is hereby rescinded.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Ordinances 13, 18 and 22 dealing with range management having never been rescinded are still in full force and effect.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the previous Ordinance No. 23 dealing with traffic violations on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation highways is and has been in full force and effect since its enactment March 22, 1954.

The foregoing resolution was on September 9, 1957 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (f), (g), (h), (j) and (n) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
