WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council recognizes its responsibility to promote the economical welfare of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe recognizes that the majority of the individual income of the White Mountain Apaches comes from the livestock industry, and

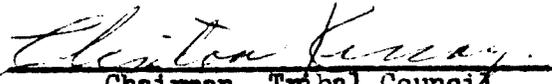
WHEREAS, the tribally owned I. D. Ranch has for a number of years:

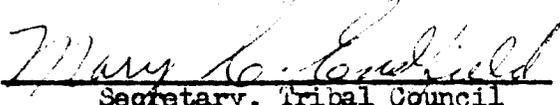
- (a) Produced high quality purebred bulls for the reservation livestock industry.
- (b) Produced high quality female stock for sale to individual members of the tribe.
- (c) Produced income for the tribe through the sale of cattle produced on I. D. ranges.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the attached Plan of Operation, Range Management Plan and Manager's Contract for the White Mountain Tribal Herd be hereby adopted and approved effective January 1, 1958.

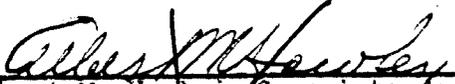
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council Chairman is hereby authorized to execute a contract with Stanley Wright at an entrance salary of \$4,660 effective January 1, 1958.

The foregoing Resolution was on September 27, 1957 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (d) and (n) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

PLAN OF OPERATION
OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN TRIBAL HERD

SECTION A - IDENTITY

1. Name -- The official name of this enterprise of the White Mountain Apache Indian Tribe shall be the "White Mountain Tribal Herd", hereinafter referred to as the Enterprise.

2. Place of Business -- The principal place of business of this enterprise shall be on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation with mailing address of Whiteriver, Arizona.

3. Definitions -- Wherever used in this plan of operation, the following definitions shall be applicable:

- (a) Secretary - Secretary of the Interior
- (b) Commissioner - Commissioner of Indian Affairs
- (c) Area Director - Officer-in-Charge, Phoenix Area
Office, Bureau of Indian Affairs
- (d) Superintendent - Officer-in-Charge, Fort Apache Agency
- (e) Tribe - White Mountain Apache Tribe
- (f) Council - White Mountain Apache Tribal Council
- (g) Board - White Mountain Tribal Herd Board of Directors
- (h) Enterprise - White Mountain Tribal Herd
- (i) Manager - White Mountain Tribal Herd Manager

SECTION B - OBJECT AND NATURE OF BUSINESS

1. Purpose -- To promote the economic development of the White Mountain Apache Tribe and its members.

2. Nature of Business -- In accordance with accepted conservation and range management plans formulated in accordance with 25 CFR 71, and within any and all limitations of available range resources, the general nature of the business to be carried on by the Enterprise shall be to:

(a) Produce high quality purebred bulls for sale to Indian-owned livestock associations and others.

(b) Produce high quality female stock for sale at established market prices to members of the tribe needing high class foundation stock and to others.

(c) Produce income for the tribe through the sale of purebred foundation cattle, steers and cattle not suitable for foundation stock.

(d) To serve as a model stock raising enterprise under proper management to be used as demonstration to the members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe engaged in the livestock industry.

SECTION D - CAPITAL

1. Source of Funds -- The capital of the Enterprise shall be composed of:

(a) The assets and liabilities of the existing Tribal Herd Enterprise and I. D. Ranch, as listed in Exhibit "B" attached hereto.

(b) Such other funds and property as may be advanced, given or loaned by the tribe (which is the legal owner of the Enterprise), or from other sources.

(c) The accumulated profits and losses of the Enterprise operations.

2. Tribal Funds -- Existing investments of tribal funds in the Enterprise, shall be taken upon the accounting records of the Enterprise as capital investment. This investment shall not bear interest or provide for a repayment schedule. Further advances of tribal funds to the Enterprise may be made on either a loan basis, with a repayment schedule and to bear interest as may be determined by the Tribal Council, or on a basis of additional capital investment in the Enterprise. Determination of whether further advances of tribal funds shall be on a loan basis or a capital investment basis, shall be made by the Tribal Council at the time such loan or advance is to be made. If any additional investment of tribal funds are made in the Enterprise, either on a loan basis or on a contributed capital investment basis, provision therefor shall be made in the annual tribal budget, and shall require approval of the Secretary or his authorized representative as required by the tribe's constitution and by-laws.

3. Distribution of Profits -- Net profits of the Enterprise shall be distributed as follows:

(a) Twenty-five percent of the net profit shall be transferred to a reserve for contingencies until such reserve totals \$75,000. This reserve shall be funded as rapidly as practicable by provision in the annual budget and may be invested in interest bearing U. S. Government bonds or other securities subject to approval of the Commissioner. No transfer will be made to this reserve if there is a deficit.

(b) The balance of the net profit, or the total of any net loss, shall be transferred to the surplus account of the Enterprise.

(c) No funds of the Enterprise will be expended by it for any purpose not directly connected therewith. No per capita payments may be made by the Enterprise.

6. Inventories -- Physical inventories shall be taken as of December 31 each year, and at such other times as may be designated by the council, by a committee composed of the manager, an officer of the council and a representative of the Fort Apache Indian Agency. Inventories shall be dated, signed and retained in the files of the Enterprise for at least three years. Inventories will be valued at cost or market whichever is lower. The inventory committee shall set such valuations based on actual or estimated average weights, invoices and/or current market prices.

7. Audits -- Unless waived in writing by the Council and Area Director, an audit of the operations and conditions of the Enterprise shall be made by an independent certified public accountant as of the close of each fiscal year at the expense of the Enterprise. The manager shall arrange for the audit. If such arrangements have not been made by December 31, the Superintendent is authorized and directed to arrange for the audit on behalf of the Enterprise. Audits of accounts and inventories may also be required by the council or Superintendent upon changing managers, and such audits shall be arranged for within 30 days of the change. Copies of all audit reports will be furnished the Council, Superintendent, Area Director and Commissioner through channels not later than 10 days after receipt.

8. Fiscal Year -- The fiscal year of the Enterprise shall be from January 1 through December 31.

9. Budgets -- Budgets for the ensuing fiscal year shall be prepared by the manager prior to November 1. The manager and council shall discuss the budget at a November meeting and the manager shall present the budget, with his recommendations, to the council. The budget shall require the approval of the Council, Superintendent and the Area Director before it becomes effective, and upon approval shall govern expenditures for the applicable fiscal year. Approval of any items included in Enterprise budgets on the basis of loans being made to the Enterprise shall be contingent upon approval of the loan in accordance with 25 CFR 21 and the instructions of the Commissioner. Copies of approved budgets shall be furnished the Superintendent, the Area Director and the Commissioner.

10. Sales -- Cattle produced by the Enterprise, or other assets, may be sold in the open market in accordance with generally accepted marketing procedures. All sales shall be for cash f.o.b. the sale point or other points of delivery, except as follows:

(a) Sales to Federal, State and municipal agencies may be made to conform to the procurement procedures of such agencies.

(b) Enterprise livestock may be shipped to be sold at livestock markets or other public or auction sales.

11. Issues of Cattle -- Members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe shall have priority for purchase of cattle from this Enterprise. No cattle issues to individual Indians will be made at the expense of the Enterprise. Cattle, in numbers not to exceed any limitation imposed by the council, may be sold for cash to individual members of the tribe at a price per head decided upon by the board and based on prevailing market prices; provided that such individuals have been declared eligible to place such cattle on applicable association ranges. Bulls shall be sold to the Indian livestock associations on the Fort Apache Reservation at a price per head decided upon by the board and based on prevailing market prices, bulls in excess of the need of the Indian livestock associations shall be sold on the open market.

12. (a) Title to all property hereafter purchased or acquired by or for the Enterprise shall be taken unrestricted in the name of the White Mountain Apache Tribe and properly accounted for. The manager shall be responsible for Enterprise property.

(b) Purchases of equipment or property or the incurring of obligations for repairs, improvements or new construction amounting to more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) shall be subject to prior approval of the Tribal Council or be in the approved budget.

(c) In the event of any loss of Enterprise property, the manager shall report the full circumstances in writing to the Tribal Council which will determine the responsibility for the loss, damage or wrongful disposition of property. The Tribal Council may authorize the disposition of property belonging to the Enterprise including the dropping of obsolete or worn out equipment or property from the records.

13. Insurance -- Fire and extended insurance shall be carried on all buildings. The manager shall arrange for insurance protection for Enterprise property and assets, through policies which provide coverage satisfactory to the Tribal Council. All Enterprise insurance premiums shall be operating expenses of the Enterprise. The manager will keep insurance policies current and on file in his office. Employees will be covered by FICA and FUTA.

14. Laws and Regulations -- The Enterprise shall comply with such Federal, State and local laws and regulations as are applicable to it. The Enterprise shall comply with the provisions of the tribe's constitution and by-laws, and all applicable ordinances of the tribe. Vehicles will comply with State license requirements.

15. Approval -- This plan of operation shall become effective upon approval of the council and the Secretary or his authorized representative. Modifications to this plan may be made as conditions warrant and all such modifications shall require the same approval as set forth in this section for the original plan.

WHITE MOUNTAIN TRIBAL HERD

Five-Year Projection of Cattle Showing Expected Income

The following is based on assumptions as listed below:

1. 70% calf crop which is approximately correct at the present time but should increase to 80 or 85% particularly in the registered herd.
2. Cow-bull ratio - 25.
3. 20% death loss.
4. 75% of bull calves from registered herd will qualify for breeding stock.
5. It should be stated that those cattle listed as commercial cattle are high grade cattle, mostly purebreds without registration papers.

MANAGEMENT CONTRACT FOR THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN TRIBAL HERD
An Enterprise of the
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE INDIAN TRIBE

THIS AGREEMENT, made this 2nd day of October, 1957,
by and between the White Mountain Apache Tribe, hereinafter referred to as
the "Tribe", and Stanley Wright, hereinafter referred to as
the "Manager".

WITNESSETH:

That the Tribe, subject to the conditions and provisions set forth
herein and in the plan of operation adopted September 27, 1957
hereby employs Stanley Wright as Manager of the "White Mountain
Tribal Herd", a tribal enterprise, hereinafter referred to as the "Enterprise",
and the said Stanley Wright hereby accepts such employment
subject to said conditions and provisions:

EFFECTIVE January 1, 1958.

THAT for and in consideration of payments to be made, services to be
performed, and rights and privileges granted by the Tribe and the Manager, it
is mutually understood and agreed as follows:

1. The Manager shall operate and manage the Enterprise in accordance
with the policies of the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council and its authorized
representatives, in an economical and efficient manner, and in accordance with
law.

2. The Manager shall conduct the business of the Enterprise in
accordance with the plan of operation for the Enterprise adopted September 27,
1957. The Manager shall be bound by the terms of said plan of operation to
the same extent as though the plan were set forth in full herein. By execution
of the contract, the Manager acknowledges receipt of a copy of said plan to be
used for his guidance, and he shall not claim unfamiliarity with the plan as
reason for failure to follow procedures and abide by the provisions thereof.
It is recognized by the Manager that he must cooperate with the Superintendent
and Range Conservationist.

3. The Manager will furnish monthly information required by the
accounting system. The Manager will permit authorized representatives of the
Tribe or the Commissioner of Indian Affairs to enter upon the premises of the
Enterprise at any reasonable time, and will make the records of the Enterprise
available for inspection by such representatives.

4. The Manager shall be bonded in the amount of \$ 50,000.00, with
a surety company or companies on the United States Treasury's approved list.
Such bond shall protect the Tribe against financial loss by reason of any act
or acts of fraud, dishonesty, forgery, embezzlement, wrongful abstraction, or
willful misapplication on the part of the Manager.

5. If the Manager authorizes any of his subordinates or employees of the Enterprise to handle funds, he shall require such employees or subordinates to be bonded in an amount, and in a manner satisfactory to the Manager and the Enterprise Board. The costs of all bonds of the Manager, his subordinates or employees shall be considered an operating expense of the Enterprise.

6. The Manager shall be allowed 15 working days, exclusive of Sundays and holidays, leave with pay annually, provided that such leave be taken only when the business of the Enterprise warrants, and any leave in excess of three days at any one time shall be approved in advance by the Enterprise Board. Any annual leave not taken during a calendar year shall be compensated for at regular salary rates. Leave may not be accumulated from year to year. The Manager also shall be allowed annual sick leave up to 15 working days, exclusive of Sundays and holidays, with pay, provided that any sick leave taken in excess of three days must be accompanied by a physician's certificate showing that the Manager was unable to work during the leave period. Any sick leave not taken during a calendar year shall be forfeited. The fact that the Manager is on either sick or annual leave at any time shall not relieve him of his responsibility for management of the Enterprise under this contract.

7. The period of this contract shall be from January 1 1959 to December 31 1960, after which it may be extended by mutual agreement of the parties thereto, provided that any extension shall not exceed a period of five years, and provided that any extension shall not be effective until approved as provided in the plan of operation. It is mutually agreed by the parties hereto that this contract may be cancelled upon 30 days written notice by the Manager of the Tribe, provided that any notice of cancellation by the Tribe shall require approval by the Area Director before it shall be effective. It is further provided that any such cancellation by the Tribe shall not operate to relieve the Manager of any obligation hereunder outstanding on the date of such cancellation. In the event the Manager requests termination, he shall arrange for a full and complete audit of the accounts of the Enterprise in a manner satisfactory to the Tribe and the Area Director, before he is released from his contract.

8. In the event of the death of the Manager prior to expiration of this contract, this contract shall be terminated immediately. The Enterprise Board shall arrange for a full complete audit of the accounts of the Enterprise, and the Manager's estate shall be liable for the proper accounting for all property and funds of the Enterprise. The expense of such audit shall be borne by the Enterprise.

9. The Manager shall receive an entrance salary of \$ 4,600.00 per annum with an annual increase of \$ 125.00 every 12 months until a maximum salary of 5,200.00 is reached. He shall be paid on a biweekly basis, the first payment to be made after the end of the first 2-week work period.

10. The Manager will be furnished adequate office space and equipment for the conducting of Enterprise business. He will be furnished a pick-up truck by the Enterprise to be used in the conducting of Enterprise business. All claims for reimbursement shall be in writing, showing speedometer reading at the beginning and end of such trips, and shall indicate the necessity therefor. The Manager, or any employee of the Enterprise when authorized by the Manager, when off the reservation overnight or longer periods of time on Enterprise business shall be considered in a travel status and shall be reimbursed at a per diem rate of \$12.00 in lieu of subsistence and lodging, computed in accordance with Government travel regulations, and for other incidental expenses incurred in connection with Enterprise business. Claims for per diem shall be supported by written statements of the traveler. Claims for other incidental expenses in excess of \$3.00 shall be supported by signed receipts.

11. The Manager shall be furnished adequate funds, equipment, materials and supplies to carry out the plan of operation, but where such funds, materials, etc. are not furnished in sufficient quantity to carry out the plan of operation, failure for this reason to carry out the plan of operation will not be cause for the termination of this contract.

12. The Manager shall be furnished adequate quarters by the Tribe at a reasonable charge based on a periodic appraisal. Utilities shall be furnished by the Enterprise.

13. The Manager shall devote his full time and energies to the successful operation and management of the Enterprise and may not engage in other activities which would interfere with proper conduct of the Enterprise business. The Manager further agrees to follow the approved plan of operation and all amendments and revisions thereof.

14. (a) No member of or delegate to Congress or resident Commissioner after his election or appointment, either before or after he has qualified, and during his continuance in office, and no officer, agent or employee of the Department of the Interior, shall be admitted to any share or part in this agreement or derive any benefit therefrom. The foregoing prohibition shall not apply, however, to contracts entered into by the Manager on behalf of the Tribe with any other corporation for the general benefit of such other corporation, in which such member of or delegate to Congress, resident Commissioner, or officer, agent or employee of the Department of the Interior is a share holder.

(b) The Manager shall not transact business on behalf of the Tribe with any other corporation, joint-stock company, or association, or any firm or partnership, or other business entity of which he is an officer, agent, or member, or in the contracts or pecuniary profits of which he is directly or indirectly interested.

(c) The Manager shall not contract with any person or corporation for the hiring out of the labor of any prisoners confined for violation of any laws of the United States.

14. This contract shall be effective only upon approval of the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council and authorized Bureau of Indian Affairs approving officer. Upon final approval by said approving officer, this contract shall supersede any existing contracts between the parties hereto.

15. The terms of this contract may be modified by mutual consent of the parties thereto, provided that before any modification shall be effective, approval, as provided in the plan of operation, to the modification shall be required.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Tribe has caused this contract to be executed by its Chairman and Secretary thereunto duly authorized, at White River, Arizona, this 2nd day of October, 1957, and the Manager has executed said contract at White River, Arizona, this 2nd day of October, 1957.

RANGE MANAGEMENT PLAN FOR
WHITE MOUNTAIN TRIBAL HERD RANGE UNIT

The White Mountain Tribal Herd perviously known as the I. D. Tribal Herd is operated as a separate tribal enterprise and is not connected in any way with the eight established cattle associations or range units.

This 5-year range management plan is subject to modification periodically as better range management practices are adopted by the enterprise. As the number of registered cows is increased, the number of grade cattle will be decreased until the Enterprise consists of all registered animals.

The range unit is located in the southeast corner of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation and comprises 137,754 acres of tribal rangeland with a grazing capacity of 2,564 cow units yearlong or 30,768 cow months. The average surface acre requirement per cow unit is 62.6 or 5.22 acres per cow month.

The principal native grasses on the range are: side oats, blue and hairy gramas, curly mesquite, Arizona fescue, beardless mountain bunch, prairie beardgrass and mountain muhlenbergia.

Most of the range unit is made up of rough, steep and rocky slopes. It is bounded on the south by Black River. The following main permanent streams flow through this unit and drain into Black River: Bonito, Corn, Willow and Pacheta Creeks. There are numerous smaller streams which alleviate the stock water situation to a great extent. Many other stock water developments exist. However, additional developments are required as indicated in the development program section of this plan.

The unit is subdivided and fenced in separate pastures as follows:

I. Commercial (Grade) Herd

Approximately 700 cows comprise the commercial herd at the present. These cows graze in the 10 of Diamonds and Poker Mtn. units starting November 1st and remain there, one unit until June 1st and one unit until May 1st. On June 1st, the commercial herd is moved to the Tonto Lake and the Cross F units.

Three hundred (300) head range in the Cross F and remaining until November 1st. On November 1st, the 300 head are returned to the 10 of Diamonds and remaining until May 1st at which time they are moved to Whirly Basin until June 1st.

The 400 head in the Tonto Lake unit will remain there until July 15th. The herd is then split and one-half will go to West Pacheta unit and the other half to Outer Pacheta unit. The two herds graze in these units until September 15th, after which the two herds are returned to the Tonto Lake unit remaining until November 1st. On November 1st, the 400 head are returned to Poker Mtn. unit until June 1st.

II. Registered Herd

A. Cows - The registered cows numbering approximately 275 are placed in West Poker unit beginning November 1st and will remain until June 1st. Beginning June 1st, the herd is moved to breeding units. On September 15th, the cows are moved to the Corner Willow pasture and will remain until November 1st. Beginning November 1st, the herd is moved to West Poker unit.

B. Bulls - The Enterprise has about 61 registered bulls at the present time. On September 15th until June 1st, these bulls are pastured in the Brushy Mountain unit. Beginning June 1st, the bulls are placed in the summer breeding units with the breeding cows and are returned to the Brushy Mountain unit after September 15th. The schedule includes 20 prize bulls in Old Calf unit used from September 15th to June 1st.

C. Breeding Units for Registered Cattle - Breeding units numbered 1 through 18 are used during the summer breeding season -- June 1 until September 15. These units will be checked annually and adjusted accordingly. Yearlong grazing capacity for these units total 63 animal units.

III. Mixed Stock

A. Steers, Cows and Bulls to be Sold - On November 1st, approximately 200 steers are placed in the Upper Hoot Owl and the Willow Calf units. They remain in these two units until June 15th. Beginning June 15th until July 15th, these steers are moved to the East Pacheta steer unit. About 75 sale cows are included with the steers when they are moved to the East Pacheta unit. On July 15th, the steers and sale cows are moved to the Tribal Steer unit.

Approximately 100 head of registered sale bulls (sold as yearlings) are allowed to graze in the Upper Hoot Owl and Willow Calf units until April 1st at which time they are sold to various districts.

B. Heifers - All (registered and grade) heifers approximating 300 head are grazed in the Lower Hoot Owl unit from November 1st until April 1st. Beginning April 1st, they are moved to the Willow Heifer unit, remaining until March 1st of the following season, coming out as two-year olds. Some will be promoted to the basic herd and some will be sold.

C. Horses - The I. D. Enterprise has about 50 head of stock work horses. When not in use, they are grazed in the Old Calf unit. The dates when they are in this unit are December 1st to April 1st. Ten head in Old Calf unit and 40 in Whirly Basin November 15th to April 1st. During the summer when not in use, the horses are in units around the breeding plant--- Paradise and Upper Corner units.

RANGE IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

Proposed rangeland improvements include stock trails and driveways, stock water development, fencing, brush control, reseeding and rangeland pitting. The proposed program to be completed within a five-year period is:

1. Stock Trails and Driveways. The construction of stock trails and driveways will facilitate the movement of livestock from summer to winter units and between special use units, such as breeding units, etc.

Present plans include a stock trail to be constructed from Paddy Creek Corral to 10 of Diamonds for a total distance of 7 miles.

2. Stock Water Development. Stock water development for this unit should be completed within the next three years. At least 5 stock ponds and 5 springs should be completed per year for a total of 15 tanks and 15 springs. The major stock water sources are: West Turkey Creek, Big Bonito Creek, Tonto Creek and Black River.

3. Fencing Program. The reservation boundary fencing program will be completed during calendar year 1957. The fence from the summer pastures to Black River was recently completed. No special use fences are proposed, only maintenance will be required on the boundary fences.

4. Brush Control. The control of approximately 1,000 acres of Alligator Juniper per year for five years should help to improve the range lands on this unit considerably.

We propose to initiate this program on the Whirly Basin unit during Fiscal Year 1958.

5. Reseeding. Reseeding of logging trails near Maverick is planned for the 1958 Fiscal Year. The acreage scheduled for reseeding is approximately 2,000.

6. Rangeland Pitting. The pitting of rangeland should improve forage production. Approximately 500 acres of the upper and lower Hoot Owl units are suitable for this type of rangeland improvement.

7. Salt Program. The proper use of salt should improve the utilization of range forage. Salt grounds should be at least one mile from stock water supply and one-half mile from Black River. Salt is used on rangelands primarily as an aid to uniform distribution and utilization of rangeland forage production. The practice of using old salt grounds year after year should be eliminated. As a general rule, salt should be removed from an area when one-half of a season's forage production is utilized by the stock.

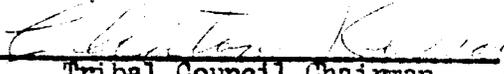

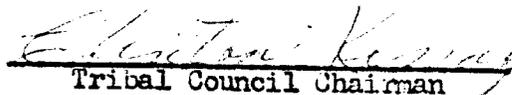
