

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
PORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe's loan program was suspended by letter of January 18, 1955, and

WHEREAS, the Council feels that there is need for a credit program for the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and

WHEREAS, a loan program should be kept active and also limited to individuals who are members of the tribe and who have proven that they can meet a repayment schedule.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council that a revolving credit loan program limited to those who have proven good credit risks and have repayed previous loans under the Bureau of Indian Affairs Revolving Credit Program is hereby adopted; PROVIDED that no educational loans will be made under this program, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Loan and Credit Committee is hereby instructed to bring all delinquent loans to a current status as quickly as possible.

The foregoing Resolution was on January 16, 1957 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (e) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938 pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
