

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Albert M. Hawley was assigned as superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency for the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, Whiteriver, Arizona, on the 20th day of November, 1955, and

WHEREAS, under his supervision and guidance the White Mountain Apache Tribe has started an expansive, industrial and recreational development program, and

WHEREAS, the said Superintendent Hawley has performed services in the interest of the Tribe above and beyond the call of duty, and

WHEREAS, Superintendent Hawley has shown a great human interest in the White Mountain Apache people and has endeared himself to the said people, and

WHEREAS, it is rumored that in the not too distant future Superintendent Hawley is to be transferred from the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, such a transfer would be a catastrophe to the economic, social and moral progress and development of the people of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.

IT IS THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Secretary of the Interior, and/or the Commissioner of Indian Affairs, and/or the Area Director, do not transfer Albert M. Hawley for a period of at least two years from his present position as Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency for the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

The foregoing Resolution was on July 1, 1957, duly adopted by a vote of 3 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article VI, Section 1 (a) of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on August 15, 1938, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on August 26, 1938, pursuant to Section 18 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 934).
